### **PREFACE**

The Tioga County Department of Emergency Services (DES) Multiyear Training and Exercise Plan (TEP) is the guide to accomplish priorities outlined by representatives from Emergency Management Agency (EMA), 9-1-1, and response teams that operate under the umbrella of the Tioga County DES. The Department has pursued a coordinated strategy that combines strategic planning, innovative training, and realistic exercises to strengthen its operational readiness and increase the quality of service that is provided to the citizens and visitors of Tioga County.

The TEP is administered by the Tioga County Training Coordinator in coordination with the Tioga County Emergency Management Coordinator (EMC) and representation from the Tioga County Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP). The Tioga County DES TEP is a living document and will be amended as needed but reviewed at least once a year.

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### **Purpose**

The purpose of the Multi-year Training and Exercise Plan (TEP) is intended to document the organization's overall training and exercise program priorities for a specific multi-year time period. It is considered to be a living document that can be updated and refined annually. These priorities are linked to corresponding core capabilities and, if applicable, a rationale based on existing strategic guidance, threat assessments, corrective actions from previous exercises, and other factors. This Multi-year TEP identifies the training and exercises that will help the organization build and sustain the core capabilities needed to address its training and exercise program priorities.

The Multi-year TEP should lay out a combination of progressively building exercises – along with the associated training requirements – which address the priorities identified in the Training and Exercise Planning Workshop (TEPW). A progressive, multi-year exercise program enables organizations to participate in a series of increasingly complex exercises, with each successive exercise building upon the previous one until mastery is achieved. Further, by including training requirements in the planning process, Tioga County DES can address known shortfalls prior to exercising capabilities.

Included in this Multi-year TEP is a training and exercise schedule, which provides a graphic illustration of the proposed activities, scheduled for the years 2017 through 2021.

### **PROGRAM PRIORITIES**

Representatives from Tioga County Emergency Management Agency (EMA) as well as the Tioga County Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) held a Training and Exercise Planning Workshop (TEPW) to discuss the training needs and priorities for the Tioga County Department of Emergency Services (DES). The requirements for Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency (PEMA) staff certification, required continuing education requirements for PSAP personnel, as well as specific core capabilities were discussed and considered. From this strategic planning meeting, the following priorities were outlined:

- 1. Increase Use and Efficiency of the National Incident Management System (NIMS) in Tioga County
- Provide PEMA Basic Level Certification Educational Opportunities for County EMA Staff and LEMCs
- 3. Promote Whole Community Resilience throughout Tioga County
- 4. Provide Ongoing Continuing Education (Con-Ed) Opportunities for PSAP Staff
- 5. Develop the DES Continuity of Operations Plan (COOP) and Provide Ongoing Training for its Implementation
- Provide Basic and Advanced educational opportunities for Tioga County Response Teams

## 1. Increase Use and Efficiency of the National Incident Management System (NIMS) in Tioga County

The Federal standard for terminology, operational structure, and chain of command before, during, and after an emergency is well defined, but not always used effectively. It is essential that all personnel working in and around the Incident Command Post (ICP) at an incident or special event, utilize the Incident Command System (ICS) properly, however this is not always the case. Additionally, all staff within a local/County Emergency Operations Center (EOC) should also use the proper NIMS format for operations. This is critical to the interoperability of EOC actions.

Furthermore, the Tioga County DES promotes continuing education opportunities for all staff and LEMCs, and recommends that they obtain both the Basic and Advanced levels of Certification as well.

## 4. Provide Ongoing Continuing Education (Con-Ed) Opportunities for PSAP Staff

The Tioga County Department of Emergency Services (DES) requires Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) Staff to obtain at least twenty-four hours of continuing education every two years. Due to the need for 24/7 staffing of the PSAP, a certain level of flexibility is needed to ensure that all employees on all shifts are able to obtain these Con-Ed hours.

By focusing on key functions and providing multiple pathways for learning, DES will provide tele communicators with or direct them toward ample opportunities both in and out of the workplace to satisfy this requirement. This will increase their knowledge of PSAP policies and procedures, provide them with basic knowledge of responders' activities in the field, and increase the level of standardization from shift to shift.

## 5. Develop the DES Continuity of Operations Plan (COOP) and Provide Ongoing Training for its Implementation

If an incident occurs that would require relocating the Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP), and/or Emergency Operations Center (EOC), it is important that all staff is familiar with the procedures that need to be followed in order to have a systematic and orderly withdraw from the Department of Emergency Services (DES) facility and relocation to the alternate site. Staff must exercise and train on these procedures regularly so that they are familiar with them in the event that a "real-world" incident occurs.

## 6. Provide Basic and Advanced Educational Opportunities for Tioga County Response Teams

Tioga County has three response teams available for various purposes, all of which require regular basic level trainings and continuing education updates:

- Auxiliary Communications Service (ACS) Amateur radio service volunteers available during a disaster
- County Animal Rescue Team (CART) Animal response volunteers available during day-today emergencies involving animals as well as large-scale disasters that require the evacuation and sheltering of pets and livestock
- Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) Volunteer team of emergency responders available to provide mental health debriefings to other emergency responders.

Tioga County ACS, CISM and CART Teams are vital organizations to the citizens and visitors of Tioga County. Increasing all hazards trainings for these teams will provide volunteers with the skills necessary to meet their operational goals.

The lessons learned from the AAR will be used to develop future training as well as policy and procedure. It will be up to the Emergency Management Coordinator and Training Coordinator along with selected staff to generate all AAR's.
