## **PROCLAMATION**

## TIOGA COUNTY DESIGNATING THE MONTH OF APRIL 2020 AS PENNSYLVANIA 811 SAFE DIGGING MONTH

WHEREAS, the month of April 2020 is recognized as "Pennsylvania 811 Safe Digging Month" across our Commonwealth, an initiative supported by Pennsylvania 811, a utility notification information center celebrating its 48th year of continuous service to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, this unique service provides an easy to use one-call notification about excavation projects which may endanger workers and jeopardize utility lines while promoting workplace and public safety, reducing underground utility damage and minimizing utility service interruptions while protecting the environment; and

WHEREAS, the Pennsylvania One Call System began with only six utility companies in western Pennsylvania and now serves more than 100,000 excavators and 3,600 critical infrastructure owners throughout the Commonwealth; and

WHEREAS, the service annually receives more than 1,000,000 notification requests and transmits more than seven (7) million notifications, providing protection to utility companies, their employees, customers, and the general public; and

WHEREAS, economic development throughout Tioga County and Pennsylvania is growing, and it is important to minimize the damage to underground utility lines, danger to workers, environmental pollution, and the loss of utility services; and

WHEREAS, we are thankful for the service provided by Pennsylvania 811 and encourage all residents, engineers, designers, excavators, and homeowners to dial 8-1-1 at least three business days in advance of an excavation project such as planting a tree, installing a mailbox post, building a deck or swimming pool, or replacing a driveway.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Tioga County does hereby proclaim April 2020 as "Pennsylvania 811 Safe Digging Month".

Hamilton and unanimously carried upon vote of two ayes and no nays to approve an agreement with Northern Tier Solid Waste Authority for dumpsters at the Tioga County Prison for the term April 1, 2020 – December 31, 2021. Pickup weekly - \$217.00

Core sampling new MDJ Mansfield bldg.

A motion was made by Roger C. Bunn, seconded by Mark L. Hamilton and unanimously carried upon vote of two ayes and no nays to approve a proposal from Professional Geotechnical Engineering Services for core sampling at the new Mansfield MDJ building site - \$7,000. Act 13.

Prison radio maintenance agreement

A motion was made by Roger C. Bunn, seconded by Mark L. Hamilton and unanimously carried upon vote of two ayes and no nays to table a three-year maintenance agreement with Capital Area Communications for the radios at the Tioga County Prison.

Eshenaur – Prison cell water pin traps A motion was made by Roger C. Bunn, seconded by Mark L. Hamilton and unanimously carried upon vote of two ayes and no nays to approve a proposal from W. C. Eshenaur & Son, Inc. for labor and material to install 14 pin traps in Prison cell water closets, \$8,526.71. Act 13.

North Country Woodworking – courthouse door A motion was made by Roger C. Bunn, seconded by Mark L. Hamilton and unanimously carried upon vote of two ayes and no nays to approve a proposal from North Country Woodworking, Inc. to restore side courthouse door hardware and installation - \$5,520. Act 13.

AEP Energy – electricity agreement

Hamilton and unanimously carried upon vote of two ayes and no nays to approve a three-year energy purchase agreement with AEP Energy, for electricity service at county locations in Elkland, Mansfield, and Morris, at a rate of \$0.05843 (per kWh).

MP2 Energy – electricity agreement

A motion was made by Roger C. Bunn, seconded by Mark L. Hamilton and unanimously carried upon vote of two ayes and no nays to approve a three-year energy sales agreement with MP2 Energy, for electricity service at county locations in Wellsboro, at a rate of \$0.063740 (per kWh).

MCM – prof. services agreement with 911

A motion was made by Roger C. Bunn, seconded by Mark L. Hamilton and unanimously carried upon vote of two ayes and no nays to approved a five-year agreement with MCM Consulting Group, Inc., to provide professional services for 911 and emergency management planning. Fees are as follows, by project and year: 911 Planning: 2020: \$21,873; 2021: \$22,530; 2022: \$23,205: 2023: \$23,902; 2024: \$24,619 Emergency Management: 2020 (for 200 hours of service/year): \$23,995; Years 2021 – 2024 fee is based on 80 hours of service/year): 2021: \$14,966; 2022: \$15,318; 2023: \$15,686; 2024: \$15,916.
