National Incident Management System (NIMS)

- What is NIMS?
 - A standardized framework for organization, communication, and resources that emergency response agencies throughout the Country are required to use
- What is "NIMS Typing?"
 - Choosing the most appropriate pre-determined definition for a resource

Resource Typing Library Tool and Incident Resource Inventory System

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) provides two resource management tools to assist emergency managers, the Incident Resource Inventory System (IRIS) and the Resource Typing Library Tool (RTLT). Both tools are no cost, user-friendly, and designed to assist communities in inventorying resources.

RTLT is an online catalogue of national resource typing definitions and job titles/position qualifications. National resource definitions are easily searchable and discoverable through RTLT. Resource definition data in RTLT can be viewed

The Resource Typing Library Tool

There is no cost to use the RTLT and a username or password is not required.

On the Web, go to https://rtlt.ptaccenter.org.

Choose either:

- Resource Typing Definitions
- Job Titles and Position Descriptions


For either category, the RTLT has an easy-to-find and easy-to-use search box in the upper right-hand side of the screen.

- Computer software
- Situational Awareness
 - Between different levels of government (local, County, Regional, State)
 - Between different geographic areas (9 Task Forces throughout the state)
 - Between different disciplines (EMA, Healthcare, 911, EMS, Fire, Law Enforcement)

- Log In Instructions
 - Click "KC Training" page should be open

 - Click "I agree"
 - Username = first initial and last name
 - Ex. "bbest"
 - Password = Tioga2017 (case sensitive)



Response Operations Plan (ROP)

- Was formerly known as the "EOP" (Emergency Operations Plan)
- Federal requirement for ALL political subdivisions <u>EVERY TWO YEARS</u>
 - Includes each municipality (PA is a Commonwealth)
- 38 of 39 Tioga County Municipalities have previously adopted the County's Plan

Response Operations Plan (ROP)

- Steps to completing a ROP:
 - Hazard Identification DONE
 - Hazard Vulnerability Assessment (HVA) DONE
 - Hazard Prioritization DONE

Then, for each hazard:

- Identify Lead, Primary, and Support Agencies 2017
- Identify Roles & Responsibilities for each agency 2017
- Develop a pre-plan 2018-2020

Response Operations Plan (ROP)

- First meeting: <u>June 22nd at 6pm</u> at Cohick Building
- Future meetings: Every fourth Thursday, same location, same time
- Plan Completion Deadline: October 31, 2017
- County and all participating municipalities must adopt by December 31, 2017
