WHEREAS, for more than a century, much of the Tioga River and many of its tributaries have been devoid of aquatic life, polluted by acid mine drainage left behind from decades of coal mining; and

WHEREAS, since the 1980s, Charlie and Joyce Andrews of Blossburg, PA, the backbones of the Tioga County Concerned Citizens Committee (TCCCC), have maintained an unwavering commitment to heal their area waterways; and

WHEREAS, knowing that an active treatment plan to restore the Tioga watershed would cost millions of dollars, the Andrews kept their community active and engaged during the long search for funding; and

WHEREAS, the Tioga community is set to see recreational fishing restored, wildlife habitat improved, and value added to their properties; and

WHEREAS, the current project, which includes an active treatment plant that will restore more than 20 miles of streams and tributaries, is being funded by the PA Dept. of Environmental Protection's Bureau of Abandoned Mine Reclamation, the Susquehanna River Basin Commission (SRBC), The Northwest Pennsylvania Conservancy and more than \$125,000 of raised dollars by the Andrews and the TCCCC. The plant is slated to begin operations by early 2026; and

WHEREAS, the Andrews have donated countless personal hours to this project and have received the William Jeanes, Sr. Award from the SRBC Commissioners.

NOW THEREFORE, the Tioga County Board of Commissioners thank Charlie and Joyce Andrews for their devotion to the restoration of the Tioga River Watershed.

WHEREAS, the Tioga County Board of Commissioners (Commissioners) have secured RACP grant funds in the amount of \$2,500,000 for the construction of the Marsh Creek Greenway and the Patterson Welcome Center (RACP Project); and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners have also secured \$750,000 in ARC funds to be used for the site work associated with the Patterson Welcome Center and the construction of the trailhead; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners have also secured additional state funding to be used towards the construction of the greenway and the site work associated with the Patterson Welcome Center and the construction of the trailhead; and

WHEREAS, the project costs, less the state funds received for this work is \$5,329,942; and

WHEREAS, the RACP is a reimbursable grant program that requires a 50% match in the form of land value or cash; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners intend to use the \$300,000 land value associated with a portion of tax parcels: 39-01.00-109, 09-02-00-081; 04-05.00-110 as partial match; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners have secured \$750,000 in federal funds and \$300,000 in local donations to be used as match to the RACP funding; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners will be required to provide \$1,479,942 in cash to fully match the RACP grant; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners will be required to provide the \$2,500,000 in interim financing for the construction of the project; and

WHEREAS, the RACP Grant requires the cash match and interim financing be committed and pledged to the project.

NOW, THEREFORE, upon a motion duly made and seconded, the Board of Commissioners do hereby adopt the following Resolutions:

RESOLVED, that the Commissioners will obligate and commit \$1,479,942 of Act 13 funds to be used as the cash match and \$300,000 land match for the \$2,500,000 RACP Grant;

FUTHER RESOLVED, that the Commissioners will obligate and commit \$2,500,000 in interim financing to be used to pay for costs associated with the RACP project;

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the source of the cash match and interim financing will be a Marsh Creek Greenway Grant checking account, held at First Citizens Community Bank with account number ending in 9602; and the Tioga County Unconventional Gas Well Fund checking account held at First Citizens Community Bank with account number ending in 6302.
